Marine City Parks

Marine City Public Beach – 200 N. Water St.



The beach offers swimming, playground equipment, an ADA mobi-mat for water access, a barrier-free sidewalk, bathrooms, picnic tables, BBQ grills & shady grassy areas. Tobacco Free. Open in the summer from the last day of school to the first day of school, 7 days a week 10:00am – 8:00pm, closed during inclement weather.

Lighthouse Park/ The Guy Center – 303 S. Water



Nautical Park is one of the highlights of downtown Marine City, featuring the Peche Island Lighthouse, sand volleyball courts, picnic tables, bathroom facilities and lighted walkways.

Nautical Park – 477 S. Water St



Nautical Park features a ship's propeller, rotary clock, benches for sightseeing, and is the site of the MC. Maritime Days Festival & Annual Antique Show. Fishing Allowed.

Mariner Park/Pavilion – 134 N. Water St.



The Mariner Park Pavilion is a beautiful covered picnic pavilion equipped with electricity, picnic tables, trash receptacles, and a dedicated outdoor grill. It can accommodate 100 people for any event. Enjoy the scenic views while gathering with friends and family. There are also public restroom facilities located within the park.

Broadway Park – 100 Broadway



Broadway Park features a battleship deck gun display, benches for sightseeing & picnics and paved and lighted walkways. Fishing allowed.

Civic Women's Club River Park – Water St.



Beautifully maintained by the Civic Women's Club, the Park sits next to the Guy Center on Water St. and features a lighted walkway, gardens, trees, benches for sightseeing and a decorated archway at the entrance.

Corwin M. Drake Memorial Park – 401 S. Water



Features a beautiful waterfront amphitheatre and antique ship's anchor and is a popular location for outdoor concerts. Located next to the Blue Water Ferry Dock.

Waterworks Park – 229 Water St.



Waterworks Park proudly features a Veteran's Memorial and Marine City Fireman's Memorial. The park offers paved and lighted walkways, picnic tables and a coin-op, long range binocular for sightseeing.

St. Clair Park – Water St at the End of St.

Located at the end of St. Clair St. at the Natural Gas filling station. The Park has a barrier free paved walkway, outdoor water faucet and a fishing wall.

South Main/Washington Mini Park (Tot Lot)

Located on the southeast corner of S. Main St. and Washington St., the mini park features playground equipment and a park bench for viewing.

Watchman Park – 131 Water St.

Named after the sculpture, The Watchman, Watchman Park is a grassy pocket park with bench seating south of the beach area.

Heritage Square – 300 Broadway



Heritage Square is home to Historic City Hall, and a bandstand/gazebo area for weddings and other outdoor social gatherings.

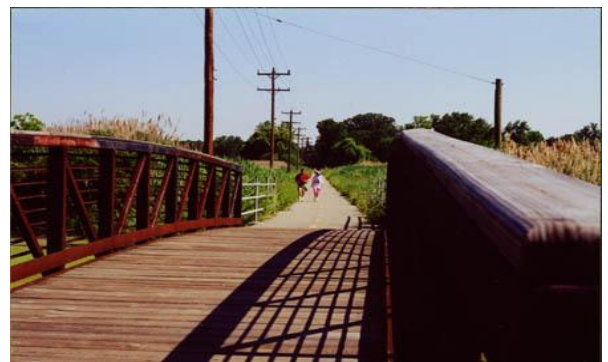
King Road Park – 6370 King Rd.

Contains 27 acres and features a softball & baseball field with bleacher seating, pavilion with picnic tables, concession stand, water fountains, BBQ grills, restrooms, a children's playground area, basketball court, a sledding hill and a seasonal ice rink.

Ward Cottrell Park – 601 Ward Ave.

A shard park between Marine City Middle & High Schools, this park features a football field, a running track for school and limited public use, tennis courts, softball and baseball fields, picnic tables, a children's playground, restrooms and a concession area.

Bridge to Bay Trail



The Bridge to Bay trail is 54 miles of biking/walking paths that connects neighboring communities from the Blue Water Bridge to New Baltimore. The various sections include boardwalks, river walks, rail trails, safety paths and bike paths.
